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particularly a 1912 Auto Supplies and a 1915 complete offerings catalog. I am still looking for these two, but did find a 1914 Sears, Roebuck and Co. Automobile accessories catalog. Browsing inside this was a close taste of what heaven must be like.

A lot of historical perspective can be learned just from perusing these pages. Of course, what is offered are those things that are in demand. The catalog offers 96 pages full of all the accessories one would need for motoring in the day. And what more important than to start the catalog with 16 pages of tires and all related accessories. There are cross section diagrams showing why **Justice** Auto Tires are superior. On the following page is a full color ad spotlighting the “famous” racing driver Spencer E Wishart. He is quoted “I am using a set of JUSTICE TIRES and they are wearing wonderfully, in fact, better than any other tires I have used. They have gone 2,700 miles and I look as though they would go that much more at least.”

Now, I don’t know about you, but I would not be happy if the tires I buy now were to last my T driving only 5,400 miles!

On the MTFCA forum discussions, we have been reading a lot about peoples’ dissatisfaction with the tires available to us today. Personally, I have a set of those infamous Excelsior tires that crack early on and wear out rapidly. Since most of our post ’14 cars have no speedometer/odometer, I cannot attest to just how many miles I have on Daisy. In 2004 I put the tires on and since 2006 would estimate that there are 12,000 miles to the credit of that wonderful ol’ gal. At first I was not aware of how badly the alignment was on the front end and after close to 2,000 miles it was noted that the front tires were really wearing rapidly. Once this was rectified, the wear on one of the tires improved, but by 5,000 miles the driver’s side tire had to be replaced but serves as a very functional if not decorative spare. There has been minimal cracking and the passenger side tire still has many miles of wear left. So I guess we can be thankful that our current poor quality tires are a step or two above what they had in the day.

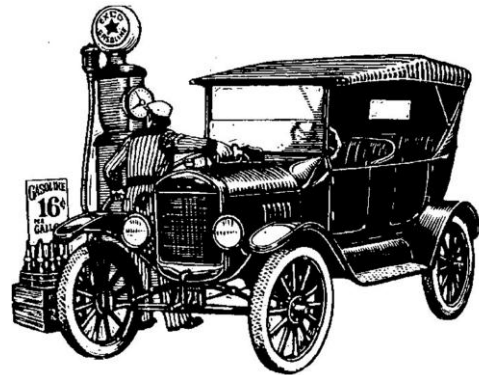
There are also red rubber tubes of many differing sizes. Following this there is the most amazing assortment of tire repair supplies and

tools. One thing I have learned from the medicine field; if there is more than one product to fill a need, then none of them are satisfactory in one way or another and none have a real advantage over the others! The assortment of patching options is amazing. To start with, you can pick from a variety of vulcanizers to patch the tube, or you can try cold vulcanizing, but you will need a special portable clamp. There is "Goodrich cold vulcanizing solution", "Vulcanoid Official unexcelled acid cure solution" and high grade Para rubber cement", "Secret Process Rubber Cement", "Michelin Mastic", "U-Vulco liquid vulcanizer" and . . ., you get the idea. There are even, surprisingly, "Ideal Patches" and "Ready for Service Patches ... no cement needed."

Tires only last so long. When they wear out, you could buy a new one or a set. Now remember that workers were getting from \$1 a day to the unheard of \$5 at the ford factories (only \$3 until you stayed on for a whole year and if you satisfied the requirements of the Ford Social Department!). A new 30x3 1/2 **Justice** casing cost \$11.90 and the tube \$2.95. That was for the smooth tread, if you wanted the Anti-Skid casing you had to shell out \$15.04. Now, on the shipping information page on the inside front cover, you learn that for parcel post, packages were limited to 20 pounds unless you lived within 150 miles of Chicago and cost \$2.40. Each casing weighs 12 pound for smooth and 14 for anti-skid, with the added 3 1/8 pound for each tube. Pity the poor bloke that owned a Chalmers that runs on 34x4 tires, they weigh 21 pounds, over the limit.

But maybe you could get by with one of the other options. There are "Triumph casing Protectors or Reliners" to go inside the damaged or worn tire, "Vulcanizer Outfits" for casing repairs, or "Standard Tread Filler" ("A high grade rubber gum, especially designed for repairing casing cuts.") You can also find "Raw Gum Repair Stocks for Tubes and Casings." For the quick repair on the road, you could use a tire sleeve (outside the casing) or shoe (inside the casing). These are offered in options that lace over the tire and rim, clips to the rim, or glues to the casing.

Once the repair is completed, you can choose from a variety of pumps. There is the "Champion Spark Plug Pump," a variety of single, double, and triple cylinder pumps, an "E-Z-2 Work Lever

Pump," and a "Sampson Compound Lever Pump."

The list just goes on and on, what fun to occupy one's afternoon and keep you from getting that restoration project finished! Oh, yes, almost forgot to mention, there is even a 9 page section just for that wildly popular new Model T Ford, that includes "a complete line of the latest approved devices for Ford cars."!

Happy motoring, and send a line if you find any documentation for the Hercules runabout or tourabout bodies for Fords.
